


# Create a Yes / No Question


Need to create a Yes/No Question? Follow these 5 easy steps!

1. Click **Add New Question** at the bottom of the page. When the question editor panel opens, **Radio Button** will be selected by default in the **Question Type** dropdown menu. When asking a yes/no question you'll want to use this question type, as it is a single-select question. You can, if you wish, change it to a [Dropdown Menu question type](#), as this also only allows your respondents to select a single answer.





2. Next, enter the question you wish to ask.



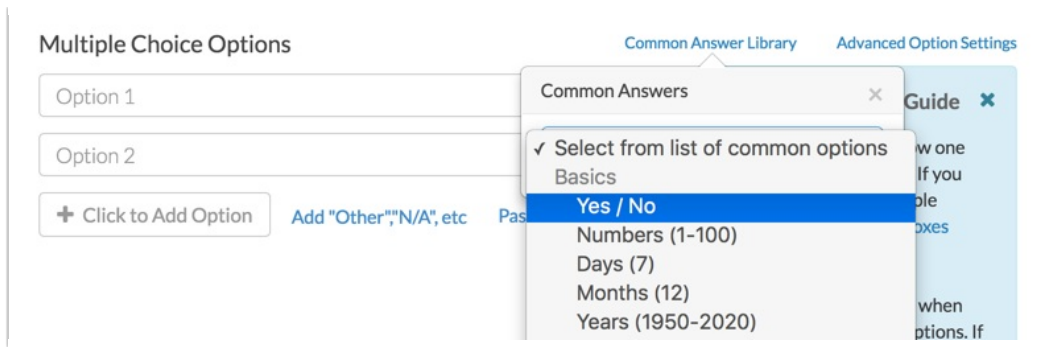

3. Click the **Common Answer Library** link.

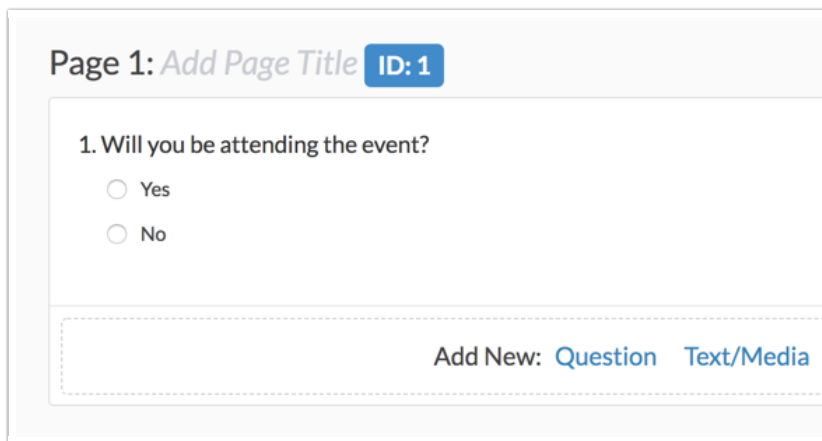
